All Health and Counseling services are free to students.

- Health Services:
 - 9am-5pm, M-F, 306 Gershman Hall
 - No appointment needed
 - Students are responsible for monitoring and administering their own medication
- Counseling Services:
 - 9am-5pm, M-F, 205 Gershman Hall
 - No appointment needed

- Proof of vaccination/booster required on health form
- Masks are optional on campus
- Testing available in Health Services for known exposures or symptomatic students
- COVID positive students will be moved to an isolation space temporarily, but will need to be picked up.

Move In and Move Out

- Residents move in on Sunday, July 9th. Residents should have received a timeslot for their move in time, between 11:30am-2:30pm
- All residents will be living in Juniper Hall, located at 311 Juniper Street. There is a small lot at Juniper to unload for 10 minutes. Once all items are unloaded, we ask that you move your vehicle to an off campus parking location. Several public lots are in the vicinity of Juniper.
- All residents must be moved in by 2:30pm. There will be a floor meeting at 4:00pm, with dinner/programs in the evening.
- Move Out - Friday, July 28th: 11:30am - 6:00pm
 - Resident will receive instructions the week prior on how to return their keys & ID to their CA on move out day.

Residential Policies

- Curfew: 10pm, everyday
- Bed checks at 10pm. Lights out at 12am.
- No guests in room, including family members (exception for move-in/move-out only)
- No weekend release, unless registered with Pre-College Office.

Highlights to bring and keep home

- Clothes for length of program - Bedding for a twin XL - Bathroom necessities - Kitchen supplies (if they wish to cook) - Quarters for laundry machines
- **Please do not bring** - candles - cooking appliances with exposed heating elements - outside furniture - Alcohol/Drugs
